Normally, MA ENGL students will take the English graduate courses on offer rather than Directed Studies or Special Topics Courses or other graduate programming in FCCS. Even if the ENGL courses on offer are not narrowly in line with a student's specific area of research, these courses will add significantly to the depth and breadth of our students' knowledge and research capabilities as they are drawn from a variety of historical, cultural, generic, and theoretical orientations to written and electronic texts. Proposals to do Directed Readings or Special Topics courses will be strictly vetted.

The minimum requirements for the M.A. are 30 credits as follows:

- ENGL 501, 503;
- 9 credits from ENGL 531, 532, 533
- an additional 3 credit graduate course from ENGL, or, with permission of the English Graduate Coordinator, one of the following options: a graduate course from another program at UBC's Okanagan campus such as IGS, the Summer Indigenous Art Intensive, the Bamfield Marine Sciences Centre Summer Field Courses, or from another university via Go Global, the Western Deans' Agreement, or the Graduate Exchange Agreement;
- Additional requirements for M.A. coursework students: one additional 3 credit graduate course from ENGL or, with the permission of the English Graduate Coordinator, from another graduate program at UBC's Okanagan campus; ENGL 590: Independent Research Paper (9 credits);
- Additional requirement for M.A. thesis students: ENGL 599: Master's Thesis (12 credits)
